On Friday 15<sup>th</sup> May the Church celebrated Matthias the Apostle. If we are asked to name an Apostle, Matthias is probably not the first name that comes to mind. It is fitting, though, that he is remembered at this time because, we are told in the Acts of the Apostles, that he was the one chosen by lot to replace Judas Iscariot after the ascension of Jesus (Acts 1:26). Not much more seems to be known about Matthias. We are told that he was one of those who had followed Jesus from the beginning of his ministry when he was baptised by John. Tradition says that he was brought before the Jewish authorities in Jerusalem for telling people about Jesus. Undaunted, he told them that Jesus who was crucified, rose again from the dead and ascended into heaven. Jesus truly is the Messiah. Like Stephen before him, he was dragged outside the city and they stoned him. But, before he died, he was beheaded by a Roman soldier. Other reports, however, say that he travelled to the area around the Caspian Sea and even to Ethiopia. All though agree that he was martyred.

Although we don't hear of Matthias in the gospel accounts, he was obviously well thought of by Jesus's followers because they chose him to be one of the Twelve.

Throughout the centuries, many Christians we have not heard of have spent their lives quietly serving God in the role to which he called them. God calls us too to play our part in growing his kingdom. Like Matthias we may seem to go unnoticed, but God knows how we try to serve him – you in your small corner and I in mine. So that, one day, we may hear God say, 'Well done, good and faithful servant.' (Matt 25:23)
