Musings

On 5th August the church remembers Oswald, King of Northumbria. He became king in 633 and is credited with spreading Christianity throughout his kingdom. He sent to Ireland for a bishop to come and help to grow the Church. Aidan came and Oswald gave him Lindisfarne for the seat of his See. The two travelled together around Northumberland. Aidan did not speak any English and so Oswald acted as his interpreter and many were converted.

Although Oswald was the king of Northumberland, there is a connection with the saint closer to home. The town, Oswestry, on the English/Welsh border is called after him. The name is derived from 'Oswald's Tree'. In 642 Oswald was killed in a battle with the pagan king of Mercia, Penda. The Battle of Masefield is believed to have taken place on what is now the playing fields of Oswestry School. (Although some historians disagree.) Tradition says that after the battle a raven flew off with one of Oswald's arms and carried it into an ash tree (Oswald's Tree) which never aged. Where the arm fell to the ground a spring appeared. The water of this spring had healing properties, especially for eye problems. The spring is still there, on Oswald's Well Lane, and is topped by a sculpture of a great bird holding an arm. God calls some into the priesthood or into a religious community, but for most of us, God calls us to follow him as we live our ordinary daily lives, as Oswald used his role as king to grow the kingdom of God and spread the Good News of Jesus.
